AS & A2 Results 2015

There will be several members of staff available in the Sixth Form Centre on Thursday 13th August to issue the AS and A2 level results and offer students advice and guidance. Year 13 students can collect their results from 8:30am and Year 12 students from 10:30am. Please note that results from any GCSE re-sit examinations and other Level 2 qualifications are not available until 10:00am on Thursday 20th August.

If students would like to have their results sent to them by post, a stamped addressed envelope should be forwarded to the school before the end of term. Results cannot be given out by telephone, but can be issued to another person. For this to happen, written authorisation must be provided by Friday 17th July. Alternatively, if students are out of the country they may see one of the Sixth Form team about having their results sent by text or email.

Confirmation of Sixth Form place

When the current Year 12 students collect their AS level results on Thursday 13th August they should confirm their Year 13 place in the Sixth Form by seeing one of the Sixth Form team.

Year 13 'enrolment' is on Thursday 3rd September. You should comply with the Sixth Form Dress Code and arrive in the Sixth Form Centre by 10.00am. The day will be as follows:

10.00 – 11.00am	Head of Year Assembly, Timetables & register for Cashless Catering
11.00am onwards	Normal lessons

Sixth Form Dress Code

Students are expected to wear the following:

Male students are should wear a block-coloured suit, consisting of a matching jacket and trousers, and leather shoes. Suits should be of a formal "business wear" style. White shirts are the preferred colour of choice but other colours may be worn as long as the shirt is "formal" i.e. no distinctly patterned, casual or fashion shirts are to be worn. In addition male students may wear a single block coloured V-neck jumper or cardigan underneath their jacket.

Female students should wear a block-coloured suit, consisting of either a matching jacket and knee length skirt, a matching jacket and trousers or a matching jacket and dress. When skirts or trouser suits are worn, female students should also wear a smart blouse or top. Single, block coloured blouses and tops are preferred and it





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must be seen as “formal” i.e. no distinctly patterned, casual (e.g. vest tops and summer dresses) or fashion blouses / tops are to be worn. Female students must wear sensible shoes. In addition, students may wear a single block coloured V-neck jumper or cardigan underneath their jacket.

Students studying PE, BTEC sport and dance must attend school following the dress code and then change into their kit for practical subjects only. Please note that students in Years 12 and 13 studying PE, BTEC sport and dance will be provided with the necessary items of the new PE kit.

The following items of clothing are not allowed: hoodies, canvas shoes, high heels, flip-flops, short skirts, shorts, thin strapped tops and sun dresses, leggings, jeggings, jean style trousers and trainers.

Please note:

- Female students who have pierced ears are allowed to have one pair of plain small studs. Male students are not allowed any form of ear or facial piercings. No other form of body piercing is allowed.
- ‘Extreme’ hair styles, including hair colours, are not permitted.
- Female students may wear light make up and discrete nail polish. Male students are not allowed to wear any make up or nail polish.
