- **Learn new skills** give you the confidence to try new things and achieve
- **Give to others** acts of kindness and giving to others to give you a sense of purpose and feel good!
- **Be mindful** enjoy what is happening right now











Expectations in sixth form ...

- You are expected to attend at least one enrichment activity per week.
- You are also expected to be a <u>subject ambassador</u> for a subject of your choice (you need to organise this with a teacher)
- You will be timetabled with the member of staff one a week and given a responsibility this could include working with an individual, working with a small groups of students, mentoring, filing, creating resources or displays
- You will need to register with the relevant member of staff, this is to track and monitor your attendance
- You may change your option each term if you choose to do so
- Form tutors will be having regular conversations with you to find out what you have been doing each term

- Volunteering in the local community


