Costs and payments

Uniforms and joining are free.

Boots are purchased by parents / carers – advice will be offered. (Typically £30-£60).

Cadet contribution to camps is approx. £3 per day to pay for food. Costs for adventurous training weekends varies by provider. Support available for pupil premium cadets.



Joining the CCF – next steps

- Parents must complete the online application Microsoft Form.
- You will need to provide us with:
 - Personal details and next of kin details
 - Medical, Allergen & Dietary Information
 - Consent to Join and participate in activities
 - Clothing sizes so uniform can be ordered.

• The deadline for applications is 6pm Friday 16th July 2023.





Joining the CCF – next steps

- The number of Cadets we are allowed to have on roll is set by the number of CFAVs we have.
- We typically recruit around 30 new year 8 students each year but this does depend on how many existing Cadets chose to continue into academic year 2023-2024.
- Places are allocated on a first come first served basis.
- Once all applications have been processed, you will either be:
 Allocated a place for September 2023.
 Placed on the waiting list to join later in the school year.
